## noの用法

There are no cars on the street.

No students were injured in the accident.

He is no fool.

# noの付いた否定語

誰も...ない          no one / nobody

私の兄ほどギターを上手に弾く人はいない。

何も...ない          nothing

光よりも早く伝わるものはない。

何も(誰も)...ない    none

None of the passengers were injured.
